- WHAT: Camp Berryville is eight weeks (four sessions) of supervised summer fun at a day camp based out of the Berryville Community Center.
- WHO: For kids about to enter kindergarten through 7th grade in the fall of 2024
- WHEN: Monday-Friday, 7:30am-5:30pm. Each session lasts two weeks (ten days); see session chart below.
- HOW MUCH: \$250 total session cost.
- HOW TO REGISTER: You prepay a \$50 deposit to reserve each session-go to https://bcc.berryvillear.gov/syp.html to register online.

Note: this deposit is nonrefundable; counselors are hired, supplies purchased, and plans are made once we know your child is coming. Lunches will be provided by OHC and the Carroll County Senior Center. Parents should pack breakfast and a small afternoon snack.

- DEADLINES: Due date for the \$200 remainder is 14 days before session starts (always a Monday). If your balance is unpaid, your spot may be given to a waitlisted camper.
- WHERE TO PAY: You can register and make your payments at the BCC front desk OR online.


